AG safety rules

As you can imagine, with around 1200 people on site at the end of summer, we need to be careful about following safety regulations at Anything Goes.

Unit Leaders – please read the safety rules below and sign this sheet to indicate your unit will meet all requirements. Your form may be dropped off at Friday Check – In.

Campsite area

- To meet current fire safety guidelines, camping areas must have a 4-metre gap after 10 metres of occupied space (as per diagram featured below).
- Units will find these four metre gaps already marked in the campsite. Please DO NOT put tents on the clearways, or you will be asked to remove them.
- Tent pegs or poles must not be placed within 1 metre of power outlets (riser poles)

Cooking area

- Please put your cooking area as close to an internal road as possible (ie, on the edge
 of your campsite, not the middle) to allow quick access for fire/emergency vehicles
- If a total fire ban is called, all cooking must stop within the campsite areas. We will provide areas for units to cook in or near the buildings.

Cooking gear

- Appliances
 - You can only use a proper, commercially manufactured gas appliance for cooking (no home-made jobs, please!). All appliances including barbecues need to display an approval badge showing they are certified.
 - Open fires, charcoal and electrical cooking appliances are not allowed
 - There are specific rules for barbecue trailers if you are planning on bringing one, you must apply fill out a BBQ form and send it to Admin prior to the weekend
- Gas cylinders
 - Gas cylinders must be secured to prevent them being knocked over. Putting them in a milk crate works well.
 - Gas cylinders MUST be within test (10 years from their last date stamp). This
 may be checked during the event. If you have an out-of-test cylinder, it will be
 taken into safe storage and returned at the end of AG. You will not receive a
 replacement cylinder, so best to be sure before you get there!

• Fire control

- Appliances must be in a stable position
- The area 3 metres from the outer edge of your barbecue must be clear of flammable material
- You must have a vessel with at least 10 litres of water nearby for immediate
- You must also have a minimum 1kg dry chemical fire extinguisher close to any appliance
- An adult must be present at all times when any appliance is lit
- The appliance flame must be completely extinguished before the adult leaves

Power

- The only electrical appliances that can be used in the camping area are phone chargers and CPAP or other health-related machines. Equipment such as pie warmers, electric powered cooking appliances and slushie machines are banned. Please don't try to convince us that a slushie machine is health related.....
- Electrical equipment including power leads and boards must be in good condition and protected from water/dew. Power boards MUST be RCD protected.
- Our on-site electrician will be out and about checking for safety
